## May Is Electric **Safety Month**

May is Electric Safety Month so here are some good reminders when working outside. Power lines are a part of life. We have come accustomed to them and sometimes we forget they are near. When working around power lines: make a plan, ensure people and equipment remain at least 10 feet from the lines in all directions, use a spotter, lower equipment to the lowest possible level when transporting (under 14 feet), practice awareness and caution when raising equipment (large or small), and never attempt to raise or move a power line, call Wheat Belt instead. Also, take note that large modern equipment, especially with antennas, can exceed the height of 14 feet posing an increased risk of contacting a power line.

Always remember if you are in a vehicle or on equipment that comes into contact with a power line, DO NOT EXIT the vehicle. Wait until utility workers have de-energized the line and have in-



structed you to exit the vehicle or equipment. In the event the vehicle/equipment is on fire and you must exit, remember hop with both feet together as far away from the vehicle/ equipment as you can.

#### **Learn How to Protect Yourself** from Scams and Fraud

As technology continues to evolve, so do the tactics of scammers trying to take advantage of unsuspecting consumers. One such scam that has been making the rounds recently is individuals pretending to be representatives of your electric utility company. These scammers will call you claiming that they are from your utility company and that you have overpaid and are due to receive a credit.

The scammer will then ask for your personal information, such as your social security number or credit card information, claiming that they need it to credit vour account.

Don't Get Duped

It is important to remember that your electric utility it is important to remember that your electric utility company will never call you to ask for personal information or demand immediate payment. If you do receive a call like this, it is likely a scan. If you are unsure if a call is legitimate, hang up and call your utility company directly to verify.




#### **Karson Loomis**
