

Tim's Tidbits

Strategic Update Lacey Gulbranson



As we continue to work through the strategic plan of the District, you will continue to receive updates on a periodic basis. Our 2019-2021 strategic plan consists of six goals: Infrastructure, Modern Energy, Technology, Customer Engagement, Broadband, and Financial Management.

In May, Rural Broadband was our strategic plan topic to discuss. In the April Rural Electric Nebraska insert, Tim's Tidbits provided an update regarding the Nebraska Governor's Rural Broadband Taskforce, on which Tim, Wheat Belt's General Manager and CEO, sits.

The four subcommittees of the taskforce are Nebraska Universal Service Fund, Data, Technologies and Public-Private Partnerships. Tim serves on the Public-Private Partnership subcommittee. The taskforce meets monthly, typically in Lincoln. During the past couple of meetings, the subcommittees have provided their initial findings/reports. The subcommittees continue fact finding to wrap up their final recommendations in the coming months. With these final recommendations, the taskforce will work towards the final charge to "recommend state policies to effectively utilize state universal service fund dollars to leverage federal universal service fund support and other federal funding". Therefore, the taskforce has actively been, and will continue, to engage state senators on the process, findings and recom-



mendations for rural broadband in Nebraska.

The goal is to have a rural broadband legislative bill sponsored and introduced in the 2020 legislative session. As the taskforce wraps up, legislative bills are introduced and policies are updated.


Wheat Belt will continue to pursue opportunities where the District can benefit from improved communications, meters and meter data and continue to advocate for opportunities where our customers have access to improved, cost-effective services across the service territory. Next month the strategic topic is Infrastructure.

Nebraska Statute 86-1101

Broadband telecommunications service; legislative intent. The Legislature finds and declares that:

- 1. The availability, quality, and affordability of broadband telecommunications service is important to the residents of Nebraska; and
- 2. Because availability, quality, and affordability of broadband telecommunications service is lacking in certain rural areas in Nebraska, combined with greater investment in urban areas, the state may be facing a digital divide.

It is the intent of the Legislature that broadband telecommunications service in rural areas of the state should be comparable in download and upload speed and price to urban areas in the state where possible and that state resources should be utilized to ensure that the rural residents of the state should not be penalized simply because of their rural residence. It is further the intent of the Legislature that the residents of this state should have access to broadband telecommunications service at a minimum download speed of twenty-five megabits per second and a minimum upload speed of three megabits per second.

Extreme Heat often results in the highest number of annual deaths among all weather-related hazards. In most of the United States, extreme heat is defined as a long period (2 to 3 days) of high heat and humidity with temperatures above 90 degrees. In extreme heat, evaporation is slowed and the body must work extra hard to maintain a normal temperature. This can lead to death by overworking the human body. Remember that:

Extreme heat can occur quickly and without warning. Older adults, children, and sick or overweight individuals are at greater risk from extreme heat.

Humidity increases the feeling of heat as measured by a heat index.

IF YOU ARE UNDER AN EXTREME HEAT WARNING:

Find air conditioning. Avoid strenuous activities. Watch for heat illness. Wear light clothing.

Check on family members and neighbors. Drink plenty of fluids.

Watch for heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke.


